

### Through the Eyes of Judith Welk


Judith Welk saw beauty in the things around her; and she found inspiration in Dundee's streets, buildings, and parks.

Born in Cincinnati, Judith Welk was a Dundee resident for 40 years. Her paintings portrayed the lives, people and places of Dundee. Judith's work has shown in countless exhibits and resides in several collections, including the Dundee Presbyterian Church, where she was an active member.

Judith admitted to feeling lonely and depressed when the Welk's relocated to Omaha; but she found comfort and inspiration in the beauty of her Dundee surroundings. ### J.N.H. Patrick's Automobile Torpedo

A teacher, lawyer, editor, soldier, businessman, J.N.H. Patrick was one of the pioneers of territorial Nebraska. In 1856, Patrick toured the West and selected Omaha as his home. He built a house at 1618 Davenport where he lived until 1871 when he built his first home on the site of Happy Hollow. He then went to Salt Lake City and made a fortune in mining.

He was one of Omaha's earliest settlers and served as a member of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Territorial Legislatures. When a legislative battle ensued from 1854-1867 over the location of the state capital. Patrick offered an amendment requiring the new capital be named "Lincoln" in honor of the war time President. Residents south of the Platte wanted the capital moved from Omaha under threat of joining Kansas. Both the name "Lincoln" and the move to Lancaster were approved.

In 1888, Patrick purchased and developed the automobile torpedo invented by W.W. Wood in 1884. The automobile torpedo was intended to destroy the enemy using chemicals to propel the weapon and electricity to guide it from up to 1,000 yards. Besides Patrick, other developers working on remotely controlled torpedoes.

Patrick struck a bonanza with his 47-foot long, 22-inch-diameter copper torpedo. It was the talk in military circles in 1890. The advanced weapon consisted of a 53-foot long, 15-inch diameter float and a submerged boat powered by chemicals and guided from shore by electricity. The float kept the torpedo three feet beneath the surface. The weapon was said to be the best offered to any navy and practically impervious to attack from guns.

At the front end, the 6-foot chamber held 400 pounds of dynamite. After this was the stopping and starting apparatus and the heating chamber. Carbonic acid gas fueled the engine. The acid was drawn from a flask through copper pipes and converted to gas by intense heat. As the gas expanded the heat increased and the speed of the torpedo increases. The torpedo was controlled by electricity from a small battery. The torpedo could be steered between two ships 25-feet apart from a mile and a half away. The 100 horse power engine propelled the torpedo at speeds faster than any ship afloat, up to 25 knots per hour. America's fastest warship at the time, the Philadelphia, went up to about 20 knots. Patrick sold three torpedoes to the U.S. government for \$20,000 each for experimental purposes and France bought one.

## **Dundee Landscaping Renovation 2024**

Hello, Neighbors!

With spring in full swing, according to the calendar, I want to share with you an update on the re-landscape project for the business district. Ten years ago, when the whole street was redone – new utility and sewer lines, all new paving etc., a variety of species of trees were planted and they are all healthy and, apparently, happy. The smaller plants, however, have not faired so well. Following the "perennial, lower maintenance" principles, we have a design that will provide a wide variety of colors, textures, heights, and pollinator opportunities. (See images in this newsletter.)

We are raising funds to make this a reality. With over \$88,000 of the \$125,000 project cost already committed, thanks in large part to a \$62,500 challenge grant, about 40 neighbors' contributions and several small grant applications pending we are well on our way. Our timing, however, is short. We want to reserve the plants this spring for planting in the fall, meaning we have to step up our efforts a bit and ask for more donations. You may donate to the project through the DMPA website, clicking on "donate" and designating the landscape project.


