Letter From the President

It is hard to believe it is already 2014. It seems like it has been winter for too long already after the cold spell in December. According to the Omaha Police, every year the cold weather brings with it an increase in automobile thefts in Dundee. Nearly all of these thefts are the result of people running their cars unattended in order to warm them up in the cold weather. Not only is this an open invitation for someone to steal your car, it is also against the law to leave an unattended car running on the street. Just this morning as I was leaving for work there were three unattended cars on the street running. I know it is inconvenient to go out to a cold car but it is far more inconvenient to have your car stolen knowing this could have easily been prevented.

Winter also brings snow in addition to the cold. Just a reminder that every property owner is responsible for removing snow from the sidewalk within 24 hours of the end of a snow event. I know the vast majority of Dundee residents are very responsible in getting the snow removed as quickly as possible. But every year we have some who are not. It is important to get the sidewalks cleared so our children can walk to school and residents, who may depend on walking as their source of transportation, can get around. If you have an elderly neighbor who may be unable to clear snow, please help them out.

Dundee is one of the neighborhoods where parking restrictions go into effect after a snowfall so that snowplows can better clear the snow off of our streets. The law requires that cars be moved to the even side of the street on even days / odd side of the street on odd days. In past years, compliance with this law has been sketchy at best. It is to our benefit to comply with this law as it allows our streets to be cleared more quickly and efficiently. Our residential streets are narrow and if cars remain in violation of the law, the plows cannot get through and it takes longer for our streets to be cleared from curb to curb.

As we head into 2014, DMPA has another productive year to look forward to. We will have at our January association meeting an opportunity for you to come question and hear from our two state senators Sara Howard and Burke Harr. This will be a great chance to talk with them as the 2014 session of the Legislature begins.






Postcards From The Past

Who remembers the warm and delicious creamed chicken at the old Hilltop House restaurant at 49th and Dodge Streets? I do! No doubt many of you remember that iconic restaurant on the south side of Dodge. It served our Dundee neighbors, and the rest of Omaha, for many decades until it closed about 35 years ago. Since closing, the building has been home to a variety of businesses and is still a thriving place in Dundee.

It's hard to believe now, but Dundee was once on the outskirts of Omaha. The back of this postcard gives evidence to that by stating it's "One of Omaha's Finest Suburban Restaurants." And, it made sure to mention that it was air conditioned. Note that in the postage stamp area, it states that "Hilltop House Will Stamp and Mail For You." I wonder how many people took them up on that? I estimate this postcard is from the 1940s.

Dundee History Presentation







The number one topic of discussion in Dundee has to be real estate. So when I ran into a Dundee friend at lunch a few months ago, of course I asked

him how the sale of his house was going. He told me a disconcerting tale of how a "for sure" sale was completely derailed by the discovery of a quarter-sized patch of mold in the attic. Since that time his house has sold, but questions remain: Are mold concerns legitimate? Or overhyped? And what should you do to prevent or solve mold problems?

A few molds like Stachybotrys atra (pronounced Stack-ee-bot-ris) can be lethal. They cause flu-like symptoms, breathing difficulties and loss of memory. Fortunately milder molds are much more common, but even these molds can cause health problems and trigger attacks among asthma sufferers. (So the question about overhyping mold concerns remains unanswered. The concerns are probably over-hyped right up until you or a member or your family suffers from a mold caused health problem.) Mold comes dressed in many colors: white, black, green, or fluorescent.

Mold spores are a natural part of the environment that you can never completely eliminate and only become a problem in your house when they land on a moist spot and begin to grow. Mold needs water to grow and it feeds on cellulose—wood, ceiling tiles, and plasterboard, for example. Because of the greater number of cellulose products used in new house construction, our old houses are a little less likely to have mold problems.

The best offense against mold is a good defense: moisture control. So repair all leaks (even tiny ones), properly

ventilate extra moist rooms like bathrooms and laundry rooms, clean your gutters faithfully (stop grumbling and get the ladder), and fix leaky windows and roofs.

What should you do if you discover mold in your house? The answer depends on the size of your problem. If the area is less than ten square feet, the US Environmental Protection Agency says you can probably do the job yourself if you follow some simple precautions. If it's a larger area, or you have a respiratory condition, or you just want to be cautious, call in a specialist. You can find many companies listed in the yellow pages under "Environmental and Ecological Services".

If you're going to tackle the problem yourself, the EPA suggests:

- Fix any water problems, preferably within 24 hours.
- Scrub the mold off hard surfaces detergent and water and then thoroughly dry the area.
- Absorbent or porous surfaces like carpet or ceiling tile probably will have to be thrown away.
- Do not paint or caulk over mold, the paint will just peel off.
- If the item is rare or of sentimental value, consult with a specialist.


During any mold cleanup operation, limit your exposure—wear gloves (long ones up to the middle of your forearms) and goggles (ones without ventilation holes) — and avoid breathing in mold or mold spores. I would recommend you wear a respirator.


