DMPA Opposition to Gas Station Liquor License Leads to Federal Fraud Indictments

Back in 2008-09, DMPA joined a coalition of Midtown neighborhood associations opposing the proposed liquor licenses for nine Infinite Oil gas stations. One of these stations was located at 52nd and Leavenworth and was the site of the tragic killing of a store clerk. Because of numerous problems with the operation of this store, DMPA and Aksarben-Elmwood Park Neighborhood Association opposed the liquor license application before the City Council and the Liquor Control Commission. State Senator Gwen Howard was a tremendous help for the neighborhoods as we dealt with numerous state agencies and her commitment was invaluable to this effort. Dan Rock also provided legal assistance free of charge which was crucial in being able to make our case at the Liquor Control Commission

DMPA uncovered serious irregularities concerning the operation of these stores as part of the case presented to the Liquor Control Commission. Because of concerns that laws may have been broken, this evidence was given to the Inspector General of the United States Small Business Administration and the Inspector General of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for investigation.

After a lengthy five year investigation, a federal grand jury in Chicago handed down a 23 count indictment against Charnpal Ghuman who owned the 52nd and Leavenworth store on October 31, 2013. He has been charged with 19 counts of bank fraud, 3 counts of bank bribery and one count of filing a false tax return. According to the indictments, the defendants allegedly created a scheme to fraudulently take more than \$10 million in SBA backed loans through the sale of 26 gas stations in Illinois, Iowa, Wisconsin and Nebraska. They allegedly arranged SBA loans through a bank official at American Enterprise Bank. They allegedly recruited purchasers and got the SBA loans based on false financial representations.

If not for the dedication of neighborhoods like Dundee-Memorial Park, these indictments might never have happened. While it was frustrating not seeing anything done for over five years, it is gratifying that justice will eventually be served.



How do you prefer your martini? Four parts of gin to one part vermouth? Or maybe the perfect martini is lots of gin and just a whisper of vermouth? (I prefer

mine with two olives. That way, I can convince myself it's really health food—green vegetables, don't you know.) But mixing the perfect mortar for repointing brick is not a matter of preference. It's a matter of old house science, but it can be just as confusing. Stephen Ford, a neighbor, dropped me a line asking about the "perfect" mortar mix:

Hi, Don,

My wife and I enjoy reading your Old Home Mechanic articles. We have an old home ourselves, near 52nd and California Street built in 1912. I was wondering if you could spare a few minutes to answer some questions.

I am about to embark on a basement project which will involve repointing some of the brick foundation. I have read your articles about this, but I still have questions. One of the articles says to mix four parts sand with the lime; another article says 3 to 1. Does it make a big difference? Similarly, one article says to let the lime putty sit for 2 or 3 days, the other one says 3 or more days. Why is it necessary to let it set up for so long anyway?

A book I consulted (The Old-House Journal Guide to Restoration) agrees that a lime-based mortar should be used, but it suggests adding some portland cement. (It gives two different proportions, cement to lime to sand--1/5/12 and 1/3/2--which is really confusing to a novice.) I'm not trying to rebuild the Taj Mahal, but I would like to do a decent job. Can I safely do without the cement?

Thanks for your help. Your articles are helping me become a better old home mechanic, even if the emphasis seems to be on "old"!

So, it's a matter of selecting the material you have. In your case you say your basement is a brick wall and I presume given its age it is a molded brick wall and the exposure is sheltered, so I would use type K. Or if you believe your bricks are soft hand made bricks then use L. The second chart then shows you the proper ratio (by volume) of materials to use. Because you don't want to mix more than you can apply in an hour to an hour and a half, I'd use a one pound coffee can as your measuring device. For type K mortar I might start with one-half can of cement to 1 1/2 cans of lime putty to five cans of sand. Then depending on how long it takes to use up that mortar you can increase or decrease the amount you make in each batch.

Do you need to add Portland cement? It's not absolutely required (for example L type mortar has no cement in the mixture) but some cement will make the mixture more workable and more durable. As you know you don't want to use a straight Portland and sand mix mortar because it will be too hard for old brick and it won't move with the brick. Instead it will crack the brick.

Why make up lime putty and let it sit a couple of days? This insures that water gets to all the lime and fully soaks in. Also since you can keep lime putty for a long time if you keep it in covered container (an old drywall compound bucket with a tight sealing lid works well) you can mix up enough for your whole job and then add sand and cement for smaller batches as you need them. By the way, in my experience a couple of days are long enough for the lime putty to sit. And since you have to wait anyway, why not mix up a martini or two?


