Foundation and the Mayor's Neighborhood Grant fund to develop the new master plan for the business district's "streetscape". The merchants have engaged RDG Design, the firm that developed Omaha's new Streetscape Design Manuel. The design process will begin at the DMPA meeting, January 12, with a "Great Streets Virtual Tour" in which streetscape concepts and ideas will be shared with the goal to begin imagining what we would like it to be. Delores Silkworth and Marty Schukert of RDG will make the visual presentation which will be followed by discussion. Please come and bring neighbors and friends to talk about how we want Dundee's business district to look. This is your chance to be heard...everyone's ideas are important. This meeting will be followed by a two day "charette" on January 29 and 30 from 9 am to 5 pm. RDG planners will conduct the "charette" in which community members are invited to engage in dialogue about design concerns, ideas and principles, helping to develop concepts and set priorities.

The January 12 meeting will begin at 7 pm with a social time, with the formal meeting beginning at 7:30. Along with the RDG planners, two other guests will be present; Captain Diane Kelly and Officer Eric Meyer of the Omaha Police Department. Officer Meyer has been patrolling the Dundee business district on weekend, late evenings this fall. Dundee/ Memorial Park is included in the Northwest Precinct which Captain Kelly commands. Both officers will be available during the social time and will make brief remarks at the beginning of the business meeting.

Perhaps you had an opportunity to read the lead editorial in the November 18th Omaha World-Herald in which the author spoke about the recent violence in the neighborhood and our response to it. For those of you who missed it I would like to quote several sentences.

"If one had to sum up the neighborhood's attitude toward the criminal element, it likely would be something like this: 'You think we're going to toss away the quality of life in one of the city's most distinctive and appealing neighborhoods? No way. What we have here is worth celebrating, and it's certainly worth defending. Our commitment and solidarity are greater than your pathologies.'

To that I add, AMEN!!!





re you singing the praises of your steam heat like they did in the 1954 musical Pajama Game?


But I can't get warm without your hand to hold.

The radiators hissin still I need your kissin to keep me from freezing each nite."

Or are you cursing your steam heat because some radiators aren't putting out much heat or radiators aren't hissing but shrieking or banging? With a little repair and maintenance—that are within the capabilities of most any homeowner—you can be singing

again.

The number one suspect for steam heat problems are the air vents. The purpose of the air vent is to open and let air escape as the incoming steam from the boiler fills the radiator. When the radiator fills with steam the air vent closes to keep the steam trapped in



Sometimes old vents can be saved by soaking them in warm vinegar for a half an hour or so. But more often than not, they need to be replaced. Luckily they aren't expensive. I found them online for \$15-\$20. Locally, your best source is from a plumbing supply house or a company that repairs old heating systems like Rybin Plumbing and Heating at 1822 Vinton Street.

To remove the air vent, first turn down the thermostat to make sure your system is off and won't come back on while you're working. Carefully turn the vent counter-clockwise by hand. If the vent is still hot, wrap it in a towel to protect your hands from getting burned. The main caveat here is: don't yank the vent, but instead give it steady pressure. You don't want to snap off the vent. When reinstalling the old valve after its vinegar soak or if you're installing a new vent, wrap the threads of the valve with Teflon tape and screw it into the radiator clockwise, turning it about 3 or 4 turns. Make sure the vent is pointing straight up.

Any steam radiator that is making a banging noise is probably not sloped properly. On single pipe systems the radiator has to slope back toward the inlet valve at a slope of about 1 inch for every ten feet or about 3/8 of an inch for an average size radiator. As the radiator steam gives up its heat, it condenses into water and the slope allows the water to drain back down through the inlet pipe and return to the boiler. Floors sag over time (but you already knew this—you own an old house) or the legs of the radiator can dig into the floor. The result is that the radiator is sloping the wrong way. With a carpenter's level and some wood shims you can re-establish the correct slope. (By the way, you can buy pre-made shims make of wood or plastic at any of the big box home improvement stores.)

Also make sure the inlet valves are all the way open or all the way closed (if you're not heating that room). Partially open valves will not help regulate the amount of heat, they will only create noise.

If you have a radiator leaking steam near the inlet valve, it is probably due to a loose packing nut or worn out packing. Remove the valve handle and the nut you see at the base of the valve stem is the packing nut. Use an adjustable (Crescent) wrench to tighten the nut. But go easy and don't over-torque it which may crack the nut or strip the threads. If this doesn't stop the leak, then re-pack the valve. Remove the packing nut and wrap new packing (graphite impregnated string which is available at almost any hardware or home improvement store) with three or four loops around the stem. Then reinstall the packing nut. When you snug up the packing nut, the leak will be gone. And then you can sing along: "I've got ::cling cling:: fsssss steam heat."



The 100 Day Cough

ou may know someone who's had pertussis (also known as whooping cough) recently, or heard that there is an outbreak occurring. Pertussis epidemics occur every 3-5 years in the U.S., and there has been an overall increase in cases over the last 20 years. 5,000 – 7,000 cases are reported yearly. Pertussis is a contagious disease that can be passed easily from person to person. It is very

serious for babies and can cause them to cough so much that they cannot breathe. Hundreds of babies are hospitalized each year for whooping cough, and some die from it.

Pertussis can cause adults or teens to have severe coughing that leads to vomiting or broken ribs. They can be hospitalized for pneumonia and miss weeks of work or school. Even worse, they can spread it to the babies at home.

Everyone in your family should be immunized against pertussis to protect themselves and any infants at



home. Parents should ask their doctor for the Tdap vaccine that includes a tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis

booster. Children 10 and older can also get the Tdap booster. Infants and toddlers need 4 shots against whooping cough, and a booster before starting kindergarten.

Whooping cough is spread by coughing.

Remind everyone to cover their mouths when coughing and to wash their hands often. If you would like to protect yourself and your child from this serious and preventable illness, please ask your doctor about the Tdap vaccine today!
