

Adopt Elmwood Park/Stream

A big Thank You to all the folks who came to Elmwood on 09 May 2009 to volunteer for the first Adopt-Elmwood-Park/Stream of the season. A total of 22 volunteers gathered at Elmwood Park and worked hard from 9 to 11am. Volunteers had their choice of working with Marty Myers in the park or with me (Trilety Wade) in the stream. The groups were split evenly making fun work of all projects.

Marty's park group included Jack and Julie Zuakaitis, John Morse, Bob and Judy Welk, Peg Gibbs and her two sons Kevin and Bob, Alice Fleming, and Helen Deffenbacher. They worked hard to beautify the front garden of the pool house by planting 80 begonia plants (provided by the City) among the existing perennials. The newly planted annuals were covered with a protective layer of mulch, also provided by the City, and then watered. As with all gardening, weeding was also an important component of Saturday's work.

My stream group included David Hedman, Jody Baines, Barbi Hayes, Jim Becic, Nancy Hawekotte, Jim Ducey, Ken Deffenbacher, and Boy Scouts Daevon Harker and Jake Wiese. This group of stream-troopers took on the daunting task of eradicating the invasive species Garlic Mustard by mechanical removal, aka pulling, and also cleaned the stream of debris, trash, and bulky items.

The next Adopt-Elmwood-Park/Stream group, which is facilitated by the Dundee-Memorial Park Neighborhood Association, will be held on 13 June 2009 from 9 am to 11am. The Environmental Club of UNO (EC-UNO) will host the Adopt-A-Park portion of the Adopt Elmwood gathering on 13 June 2009. Hosting involves recruiting additional volunteers, working with DMPNA to identify tasks, and leading the two-hour event.

Please consider volunteering with UNO Students and neighbors at the Park on June 13 to clean-up the park, weed, mulch, and many other tasks. And don't forget we always need volunteers to clean trash out of the stream corridor, assess problem areas, and pull garlic mustard. Midtown Neighborhood Alliance Report

he Midtown Neighborhood Alliance met May 20th at the Neighborhood Center. Hanscom Park Neighborhood Association has asked to join and they had a representative attend the meeting.

The Re-Tree Midtown effort continues to move forward. Requests for bids from local nurseries went out May 1st and Indian Creek Nursery has been chosen to do the work. Dundee-Memorial Park's part of this initial project is along 52nd Street between Underwood Ave. and Cass St. We should hear about the final grant application with Mutual of Omaha in the next few weeks. It is hoped that the actual planting can be done during Re-Tree Nebraska Week which is Sept. 19-26.

The annual Midtown Neighborhood Alliance Fireworks Show is scheduled for Sunday, July 5th at 10:00 pm. The fireworks will again be shot off at the Field Club of Omaha, 36th & Woolworth Ave, and should be visible throughout Midtown.

Infinite Store Update

Two of the Infinite stores in south Omaha have been leased to a new corporation that appears to be yet another attempt by the current owner to get a liquor license in someone else's name. The lawyer for the owner has stated that they are not leasing the 52nd St. store. However, cars from Missouri have been seen at the store in recent weeks which is where this new owner is from. The State Fire Marshal has been contacted about safety concerns concerning the abandoned gas pumps at the station. According to the State Fire Marshal, Infinite has been very uncooperative in following orders they have issued to secure these pumps. They are now working with the Douglas County Attorney on possible legal action. The store has been hit by graffiti numerous times this spring. John Tyou've been waiting for your share of the government bailout money, your time has come. While you're not going to get the big bucks that the miscreants at AIG got, the government is offering

meaningful money for homeowners. Specifically the federal government is offering tax credits for homeowners who improve the energy efficiency of their homes and this is especially good news if you own an old house. But the rules and requirements are bit tricky. So, to get a good fix on how all of this works, I spoke with an expert in the home improvement field, Jon McCormick, president of American Building Supply, an Omaha company.

"Tax credits are available at 30% of the cost, up to \$1,500, for existing homes for: windows and doors, insulation, certain HVAC upgrades and a few other products," says McCormick. The tax credits apply to improvements placed in service between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2010. "Unfortunately", McCormick notes, "energy efficiency upgrades made last year don't qualify, but going forward there are opportunities never offered before. Homeowners can put more money back in their pockets at tax time and save now by cutting their energy costs. It's a win, win situation."

But McCormick cautions, "Every product out there does not qualify for the tax credit. For example, not every window manufacturer has a window that meets the (government's) requirements. If you put new windows in service between January 1 and June 1 of this year those windows must meet Energy Star criteria to qualify for the tax credit. After June 1 the requirements are more stringent. Just meeting Energy Star criteria is not enough. After this date windows have to have a U Factor equal to or less than .30 and Solar Heat Gain Coefficient equal to or less than .30. And, guess what, the government may not just take your word for it. You could be audited. So take the Manufacturer's Certification stickers off the windows and keep them in a file with your tax returns along with your purchase receipts in case of the government checks up on you. So what consumers need to know is to do business with a reputable company, a reputable manufacturer so the product tests out to what it says it will and you get your stickers." Improvements made in 2009 can be claimed when you file your taxes next year. Go to www.irs.gov for Form 5695 (2009 Version).

The tax credit as applies to setback thermostats, certain heating and air conditioning equipment and insulation, among others. There are many energy upgrades which will improve the comfort in your old house and make a serious dent in your gas and electric bills. McCormick advises "consumers to bundle together energy-saving products to maximize the amount of their tax credit. You get the payback plus the added valuation in your home." But bear in mind the tax credit only applies to the product itself, not the installation costs. So when you get bids for your energy upgrade projects, make sure the bidders break out the product costs separate from the labor costs so you can calculate the amount of your tax credit.

There are a few other–less common--home improvements which also qualify for the Federal Tax Credits for Energy Efficiency. Visit www.energystar.gov for the details.

"The energy efficiency tax credit stimulus is really targeted toward old houses like those in Dundee," McCormick observes. "The goal is to bring old houses up to the energy-efficiency standards of new home construction and reduce the carbon footprint. Improving your home not only takes advantage of the tax credit but also is a way to be responsible and green."



In three short months, the Dundee Community Garden has gone from the dream of a small group of people who first met in February, to the reality of a large sunny site full of garden plots in May. We would like to celebrate the beginning of a wonderful community resource by holding a Grand Opening Ice Cream Social at the garden on Sunday June 14, from 3-5 p.m. All are invited to visit the garden, have a brief tour, and enjoy ice cream and root beer floats. We'll have face painting and bubbles for the children.

ASCENSION

Sculptor: Jake Balcom Memorial Park Rose Garden

"I felt that an organic shape would be best in a nature setting, something that would exist in harmony with the gardens, interacting with and complimenting the roses during the summer and standing up to become the focal point in the winter. It also seemed appropriate to respect the memorial south of the gardens and I wanted something airy so as to not completely block the view of the Memorial Wall. A design emerged which seemed to explode with life, rising powerfully out of the ground, yet soft and elegant in form, a form that seemed to adequately represent growth and the vibrant nature of a garden full of beautiful flowers. I chose the name ASCEN-SION because it felt like the sculpture was still evolving, as if this was just an early snap shot in its life cycle, and it would keep growing larger and larger, rising to a monumental scale."

ASCENSION was commissioned by the Dundee/Memorial Park Association with funds contributed by an anonymous donor. It was dedicated to the city of Omaha on June 6, 2009.
