

If you're going to hire a contractor to renovate, repair or paint your old house, starting April 22nd the process is going to get more complicated

and it's likely to be more expensive. On that date new, tougher regulations from the Environmental Protection Agency regarding lead paint take effect. As you might expect, contractors and remodelers are complaining that new rules are too stringent and some health home advocacy groups say the new rules don't go far enough. Regardless what you think of the new rules, I'll try to outline for you what you need to know as an old house homeowner.

I am appreciative of Rob Gibson, owner of R.G. Paint and Decorating, Inc., for bringing the new lead paint rules to my attention. Rob has been painting for a living for more than 25 years. He has painted too many houses in this neighborhood to count, so he knows his way around paint and old houses. Recently, we sat down at the Dundee Dell where Rob explained the new rules to me.

According to a press release from the EPA "under the "Lead: Renovation, Repair, and Painting Program" rule, contractors working in all rental housing built before 1978, as well as in older non-rental homes inhabited by children under age six or pregnant women will required to post warning signs, restrict occupants from jobsites, contain work areas to prevent the spread of dust and debris, conduct a thorough clean up, and verify the effectiveness of cleanup efforts. The new standards will extend to builders, painters, plumbers, and electricians. The standards will apply to any renovation, repair, or painting contract involving the disturbance of more than 6 square feet of lead paint in an interior room or 20 square feet of lead paint on an exterior wall.

Lead exposure can pose health risks to people of all ages, young children are most at risk because their nervous systems are still developing, and because they are more likely to ingest lead residue from interior surfaces such as walls and window sills." Adding lead to paint was banned by the federal government in 1978, so it is almost a sure bet that every house in Omaha's older neighborhoods has at least some lead paint somewhere.

Gibson, who has completed the EPA required training and certification program, says for exterior painting that involves scraping or sanding more than 20 square feet (which means virtually every exterior painting job) the contractor is required to spread plastic sheeting in a ten-foot swath around the house and securely tape it to the house. Then a perimeter of caution tape has to be placed ten feet beyond the plastic. At the end of the job, the plastic has be rolled up and discarded. During the job the painters must wear Tyvek suits and each time they are taken of--for a lunch break or at the end of the workday—they must be thrown away and replaced with a new suit. To prep surfaces, old paint must be wet-scraped, where the paint surface is

wet-down with a spray bottle before scraping. There are additional rules and techniques contractors must follow and interior remodeling work requires similar protective measures. All of this adds costs in time and materials for contractors, costs which will be passed on to you, the homeowner. The EPA estimate of an additional 65 dollars per remodeling project has been challenged by remodeling professionals. The real additional cost, according to Gibson, is more like 250 dollars per project. Expect renovation, repair and painting costs to increase. But there may be another side effect of the rule, Gibson says. "Many contractors, to avoid the restrictions of the new rules, will just choose to work only in west Omaha and not to work in older neighborhoods like Dundee."

While the EPA would like everyone to follow their procedures for working on surfaces coated with lead paint, the new rules apply only to contractors, not homeowners working on their own homes. Also, homeowners can "optout" of lead-safe practices if no children under six years old or pregnant women live in the house. (This provision is under scrutiny and the opt-out option may be rescinded by the EPA at some future time.)

Meet the Merchants

Abby Klusmire Jordan at eCreamery

s business liaison to the Dundee-Memorial Park Association, I am given the opportunity to share my thoughts, ideas and discoveries about our Dundee merchants with you readers. In that vein, I decided to create a monthly article, "Meet the Merchants," and our first installment is focused on Dundee's own Abby Klusmire Jordan, co-owner of eCreamery Ice Cream Shop on the 50th and Underwood corner. Abby, a native Omahan, comes from a large Italian family and from childhood knew she wanted to be in the food business in some way. In late 2007 along with business partners Becky App and Mark Hasebroock, she opened eCreamery in the former Ted & Wally's store. It is a delight to see the lines flowing out the door in summer, and see a bustle of patrons inside in winter. We are grateful that Abby and her friends took the plunge to see that the tradition of an ice cream store in Dundee is carried on in the 21st century.

eCreamery is greatly appreciated not only by Dundee and other Omaha residents, but by ice cream aficionados across the country. Hence, the "e" in eCreamery's name. They can and do ship unique and colorful flavors to all corners of the country. But there is only one store in which you can walk right in and ask for a cone, a cup, a pint or a gallon – and that store is in Dundee. Abby's far flung customers include former Miss America, and current star of Ugly Betty, Vanessa Williams, who ordered an original eCreamery flavor called Vanessa Williams Holiday Mix to send to over 40 of her friends as holiday gifts. Another celebrity customer is chef Rachel Ray, whose favorite flavor is "Izzy's Pick Me Up"- a flavorful coffee gelato embellished with chocolate chunks and pistachios.

By the time you are reading this, Abby will have just returned from a trip to the South Beach Food & Wine Festival, in South Beach, Florida where celebrity chef Emeril Lagasse asked her to join him in his "Bubble Q" event, involving quantities of champagne and eCreamery's rum-laced "Drunken Monkey" ice cream. Abby returns home on March 1, so be sure to ask her about the event, or ask her to whip up a batch of the "Drunken Monkey" ice cream Emeril loved so much.

Speaking of "whipping up" a batch of ice cream, it may sound quick and easy, but doing it the eCreamery way involves quite a bit of labor. All their ice creams are hand made, hand mixed, and hand packed. They make their own flavors and even their own labels. For the first year, Abby did most of the kitchen work by herself, but

things have developed and now they have a chef, Ms. Kelley Steele, and a staff making up a 10-person team. A batch can be as small as a gallon but no larger than four gallons, so every batch is given devoted attention.

ucts, keeping as much of the business local as she can. For their Big Mama's Sweet Potato Ice Cream, Abby gets the sweet potato pie filling from Big Mama's and uses that as the flavor base. Abby also buys other ingredients from local and regional vendors, including nuts from Nebraska's Heartland Nuts, and brownies from La Charlotte, owned by Omaha friend Jackie Caniglia.

Not only is Abby sending her ice cream across the country, she and her crew are getting significant national media attention, including a segment on "The View" with Barbara Walters, Whoopie Goldberg and others, which aired February 12, 2010. In all, the past two years have been quite a wild ride for Abby, who was married a few months ago to Scott Jordan, and capped off her wedding reception with an after-dance bowling party in the church basement.

Although eCreamery's biggest business is creating special flavors for special orders, they cater to us in Dundee, where their hearts are, and where they can have some of that face-to-face time with their friendly Dundee neighbors. She is truly Dundee and she is ours! So, drop in for a special treat, or ask Abby to make up a batch of that soon-to-be famous "Drunken Monkey" ice cream.






